

JUNIOR GOLF POLICY

The Bluenose Golf Club has a tradition of providing a very fun and active program for Junior Golfers. The Club has been engaged with junior and amateur golf throughout the history of the club, and provides significant teaching and training opportunities for new golfers looking to have some fun, and for those playing competitively.

To ensure that Junior Golfers enjoy the privilege of a membership, while adhering to the current Bluenose Golf Club policies, the following guidelines are specific to Junior members:

- All Adult Volunteers who work directly with the Junior Program will have a Criminal Record/Vulnerable Sector Check completed. Parents and Guardians do not require a criminal check to help out.
- Junior Golfers aged 8 and under must be accompanied by an adult at all times while on Bluenose Golf Club property.
- Junior Golfers aged 12 and under must be accompanied by an adult while out on the Golf Course.
- Junior Clinics are offered weekly in July & August and are Free for all Junior Members.
- Junior Golfers are eligible to receive one Free small bag of range balls per day.
- Tee Times are reserved for Junior Golfers enrolled in clinics to play up to 9 holes directly following their clinic time. Group sizes and Tee Time are determined by the Junior Program Coordinators.
- If a Junior Golfer wishes to play on the course at any other time besides the allotted times on Junior Clinic days: juniors aged 13 and over may book a tee time up to 7 days in advance, and Juniors aged 12 and under may book tee times up to 2 days in advance. Tee times may be made online or by contacting the Pro Shop.
- All members, including juniors, are expected to complete the 9-hole round within the recommended time period to keep the tee times on schedule. If a group cannot keep pace, they may be asked to let faster groups play through or skip holes to maintain the pace of play. This will be managed by the Pro Shop staff.
- Junior members are welcome to use the Clubhouse facilities at any time, with the exception of during special events.
- All members, including juniors, are expected to follow the BGC Code of Conduct Policy, which includes practice areas, the Clubhouse, and on the Golf Course. Any incidents will be dealt with on an individual basis, and disciplinary decisions will be made by the BGC Junior Coordinator.
